Actually, I could not believe that these feelings had come upon me, for I have co-pastored with my husband for years and have been a speaker and leader for a long time. There was just something "ultra special" about this Emmaus Women's Walk #63 and I wanted so much to be all that God desired me to be. Our Team had prayed, worked hard, practiced, worshiped together, and believed together that God would do awesome things on this walk. But, as I drove closer, I had to proclaim once again, "Honey, I am so jittery and I feel sick!" After a few moments, my husband laid his hand on my arm and said very gently, "Honey, His grace is sufficient for thee." Ahhhhh! His Peace descended upon me at last!



So many of the Team Members had suffered so many trials, troubles and tribulations during our teaming preparations and even just after many of us

returned home new ones arose. Cancer, family deaths, accidents, the loss of precious pets, church family challenges, tremendous parent and children needs, job problems.....the list went on and on.

However, by the GRACE OF GOD, we all made it safely to Camp Happyland. Thus began this "first-time-teamer's" experience of watching God use His people in mighty ways, perform miracles, healings, deliverances, and to see Him literally perform "Heavenly transformations" for the pilgrims and for the team, before our very faces! His Spirit Alive was evidenced in all the talks and presentations, the music, the table discussions, the "dying and defining" moments, and in late night confessions in the chapel. Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ:

The clear waters of the canal shimmer and ripple as the spring wind blows eastward. Splashes of blue, gray, and white sky are separated from the water only by quaint dockside homes. Sail, motor, and fishing boats line the bulkheads. Sparrows peck the ground searching for crumbs. Mama duck skims across the water's surface as ten ducklings follow. She breaks formation only to steer one of her little ones back on course.

Early risers are beginning to gather at a little café for coffee, fresh-baked pastries and the morning paper. Boat captains are checking their supplies one last time before they shove off. On a cottage steps, a baby sleeps on his mother's arm as she kisses her husband Godspeed. Dad straddles his bicycle, slings his backpack over his shoulder, and begins to peddle off to work. He circles back to the front steps of his home to pick up his forgotten lunch and one last kiss.

As I sit outside a little coffee shop by the canal, a eureka thought came to me, "The world I see in the news, view on reality television, and talk-shows is not the world in which I seem to live. It is a world that I have self-created in my mind by positive thinking, dreams, hopes, and prayers through my personal relationship with God."

"Whoa Dennis, that seems to be a little too deep of a thought". To sum it up in simpler terms, I try to live in God's world through the experiences where He guides me. If I dwell in the negative, I see the ugliness of the world. If I live in the positive, God removes the scales from my eyes and allows me to see the beauty of His creation.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could always live in the positive! Speaking for myself, I am often guilty of running off course. The negative often creeps up on me, and I see the world through foggy lenses. Nothing goes my way. I expect the worst out of people, and God's Kingdom seems to pass me by.

For example, this morning I woke up as a man on a mission. I showered, shaved, dressed and left the house to run errands. I went to the drug store, grocery store, produce market and the cleaners. I completed my mission without a single smile or a "good morning."

I had parked my truck on the street at a parking meter. I made my way back to the truck with my laundry over my shoulder and plastic grocery bags in both hands. I encountered a man leaning against a car with what appeared to be leaflets in his hand. He asked, "Do you have the time?" In my hurried, "man on a mission" mind, I thought he was selling something. I thought he wanted my time to give his best sales pitch. I replied, "Not at the moment". I kept walking and noticed a very puzzled and disappointed look on the man's face. He mumbled something back as I opened the truck door and stashed my purchases.

The look on the man's face haunted me. I asked myself, "Dennis, what is wrong with you?" I closed the vehicle door, turned around, and retraced my steps. I walked up to the man and apologized. All he wanted from me was the time of day. I quoted the time and chatted with him for a few moments. I found that in his hand was a stack of papers he needed for a meeting. The person he was waiting for was late.

God had stopped me in my tracks. He sent me a messenger, and pointed out to me my injustice. He removed my blinders and gave me a way out. He allowed me an opportunity to say that I was sorry and to change my course.

I am reminded of Saul, who was also on a mission. He had set out to kill as many Christians as he could. A light from Heaven struck him blind and Jesus spoke to him. In Acts 9:17-19, the Lord sent Ananias to Saul. "Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. Pacing his hands on Saul, he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here, has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength."

I'm across the street at the coffee shop now writing these words on a tablet I purchased at the drug store. My world looks very different now as I realize everything looks brighter now. I had risen this morning and began my day without my usual prayer time. I was too busy and had too many things to accomplish.

The scene I described at the beginning is not in New England or anywhere you might have guessed. It is in Queens, New York. God surrounds me with His paradise in the least expected places. He is my loving father and all I have to do is believe, remain willing to change, and to talk with Him. It all seems to work out better when I have a positive outlook.

May your world become larger, brighter, and more beautiful today because of your personal relationship with Him.
