This is the time of the year when I reflect on the past year and look forward to the new. I don't believe in New Years resolutions, but some healthy reflection helps put things in perspective.

This past year has seen many changes, and many things that have stayed the same, but all in all I think we made many positive gains in the Community. There are a couple places we need to adjust such as the training I mentioned in last months letter. If the membership better understands the way the community works the better we will be able to do what we do.

This thing we call Emmaus has deeply touched the Fredericksburg area. I hear of lives that have been positively changed almost every day. It is this encouraging word that gives me strength and motivation to go on in spite of obstacles and problems that arise. I was explaining to an acquaintance one time what the Emmaus Community was and how it was made up and what we do. Their only comment was that they were amazed that so many different churches and denominations were able to get along and cooperate with one another to work to together.

Indeed this has become one of our greatest victories and is our greatest challenge as we forge into the new year. It is only with God's grace and love and mercy that we will continue to make this Community work. We MUST remember that this is the body of CHRIST! This is God's Community, God's walk, God's weekend, God's body, God's music, God's Team.

We get in trouble when one person uses the words, I, my, and mine. When it becomes about you instead of the good of the Community we are in trouble. There is no room in our leadership for anyone that puts their own agenda or need for attention ahead of the needs of the Community.

A community is like a choir or an orchestra. As long as everyone follows the music and the conductor they do something wonderful. If one person decides to not follow the conductor, and do their own thing, and draw attention to themselves, they can throw the whole group off. On a small scale we see this at a gathering or a candlelight service. If the music people arrive late or play too many songs, or a speaker does not follow guidelines or a pastor runs too long on communion devotion, any one of these things can throw a service off and mess up a schedule. Yet if every one does their job and follows their individual guidelines we can see a service well executed and the Holy Spirit still has room to work and move on all of the participants. The same thing is true on the grand scale of an entire walk or the whole Community.

The apostle Paul makes this illustration in 1 Corinthians chapter 12. From the Amplified Bible...

11 All these [gifts, achievements, abilities] are inspired and brought to pass by one and the same [Holy] Spirit, Who apportions to each person individually [exactly] as He chooses.

12 For just as the body is a unity and yet has many parts, and all the parts, though many, form [only] one body, so it is with Christ (the Messiah, the Anointed One).

13 For by [[d]means of the personal agency of] one [Holy] Spirit we were all, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free, baptized [and [e]by baptism united together] into one body, and all made to drink of one [Holy] Spirit.

14 For the body does not consist of one limb or organ but of many.

15 If the foot should say, because I am not the hand, I do not belong to the body, would it be therefore not [a part] of the body?

16 If the ear should say, because I am not the eye, I do not belong to the body, would it be therefore not [a part] of the body?

17 If the whole body were an eye, where [would be the sense of] hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where [would be the sense of] smell?

18 But as it is, God has placed and arranged the limbs and organs in the body, each [particular one] of them, just as He wished and saw fit and with the best adaptation.

19 But if [the whole] were all a single organ, where would the body be?

20 And now there are [certainly] many limbs and organs, but a single body.

21 And the eye is not able to say to the hand, I have no need of you, nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you.

Can the eye say to the hand I have no need of you???? Can we say to one another, in this body of Christ, I am more important than you?? Do my needs or wants out weigh yours?

Again we have this reminder in Romans 12:3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.

Ponder these things as we enter into the coming year. We do not know what the year holds, but we should be willing to give one another grace, love and mercy as Christ has given it unto each one of us.
