Emmaus is a ministry that seeks to do just that – to build up Christian leaders and put them back into their churches.

God will give you some bacon – if you are willing and listening for His promptings. He will have you step outside your comfort zone. Easy – not normally. Rewarding – yes it is.

## *From the Community Spiritual Director*

For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God. For, all men are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field; the grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of the Lord stands forever. (1 Peter 1:23 – 25, NIV)

At the writing of this I am both elated and saddened at the same time. Elated because June marks the last month of my tenure as your Emmaus Community Spiritual Director. It is time for me to step away, but I want to thank all of you for the support that you have given to me and to ask that you give the same support to my replacement. I know that, as always, you will perform admirably.

This being my last newsletter article I wanted to leave you with a thought that is pressing in upon my mind and one which I would ask you to prayerfully consider and then to do with as your God and your conscience direct.

I have a very great concern for the state of Christianity today. More specifically, I think that apostasy has entered the Church in the guise of evangelical Christianity. The Bible speaks of a “Great Falling Away” in the last days – right before Christ returns. For decades it was thought by many that this falling away would be marked by multitudes leaving the Church. I have come to the conclusion; however, that the great falling away is actually marked by a great number within the Church who have simply abandoned the reality of Christ. This would be consistent with the other warnings in Scripture concerning those who would “Not endure sound doctrine” and “have a form of godliness but deny the power thereof.”

I am personally seeing that trend in the Church around the world today. And what concerns me even more is that good Christians, who have placed their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as both Savior and Lord, are being misled and duped by charlatans posing as Christian preachers and teachers but concerned only with their own gain. We seem to have lost the ability to discern.

I believe that most, if not all, of this is the result of a lack of a high and holy view of Scripture. This generation of Christians has become the victims of individuals who would seek to destroy or to compromise the absolute truth of the Word of God. Some Churches in the world today do not even believe that there is any absolute truth found in the word of God, but that the Scriptures are open to private interpretation and application as a person sees fit.

Paul told Timothy that “All Scripture is given by inspiration of God...“or God-breathed.” And here in 1 Peter, the Apostle Peter notes that the Scriptures are the “living and enduring word of God.” If the Scriptures are indeed the inerrant, holy Word of a holy God, should we not give more weight to what the Bible has to say rather than, say Doctor Phil, or Oprah, or you name the famous personality? Moreover, would we not be better off to govern our lives completely by the Word of God, to give credence to what God thinks rather than the ideas of man?

Matthew 4:4 says that “man is not to live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.” It is my earnest desire that all Christians everywhere would understand the vital importance of knowing and applying the Word of God to their lives. In addition, I pray that all of God’s people would understand that we are not at liberty to pick and choose which portions of Scripture we are going to accept and which we are going to reject because it doesn’t comport with our notion of life.

Peter notes that you and I are like grass and our glory like the flowers of the field. When I was getting ready to retire from the Marine Corps I was told that each of us makes the same impact in the long term as a finger stuck into a pail of water, as soon as you pull the finger out and the ripples die down it is as if you were never there. So is our existence here on earth, it is but a vapor, here for a little while and then in eternity. Accordingly, I would think that pleasing God is more important than pleasing man and to that end we must, must, must be students of His Word.
