Thoughts from the Community Lay Director...

Once upon a time, a long, long time ago, I was a new, innocent, board member just beginning my term on the board for the Fredericksburg Emmaus community. When the Letter of Agreement came around the table, I confess that I briefly looked at it, signed it, and passed it to the next person. "No problem," I thought.

Right. No problem, in my dreams.

Before I discuss my personal experience, let me give you some background. Our community, as you probably already know, annually signs a covenantal agreement with the Upper Room International Emmaus Office. This document states the agreements that exist between the Emmaus Office and our community. Among a list of statements we agree to, is to, "...carry out the three-phase method of Emmaus in accordance with the most recent edition of *The Upper Room Handbook on Emmaus* and the most recent editions of the Upper Room Emmaus manuals."

No big deal, right? I mean, really. What were we doing that could ever be an issue? Well, that was what I thought two years ago. Then, "things" began to happen that forced me to reconsider my thinking regarding our covenant agreement with the Upper Room.

First, I attended a training session facilitated by an Upper Room representative. This event was my first "awakening" that we might not be fully in agreement with what we said we would do when we put our cumulative John Hancocks on the dotted line. For example, I remember thinking things like, "What do you MEAN we should make our agape anonymous? Are you CRAZY?" Then, I listened, and I mean really listened, to the explanation for that, and many other things. You know what? I had to admit there was merit to what he said (I hate when that happens).

Second, I learned that previous board members knew we needed to make progress toward following the manual guidelines. In my mind, all I could think was, "Aren't we already doing that? What's wrong with the way we're doing things?" Oh, me of little knowledge and understanding.

Finally, after getting over myself, I decided to read the manuals that everyone was talking about. As I started reading, all I could think about was the amount of prayer, effort, and care that went into creating them. I could see God's Hands all over those manuals. They weren't the legalistic rulebooks some claimed them to be. Amazingly, it was people, just like you and me, who spent their time creating a program that would bless people far beyond anything they could predict.

(I know that factoid because I went to the recent training session in September).

Awesome.

Now what? What do we do, now that we know what our agreement is with the Upper Room? What do we do now that we know, deep down, that we have a covenant agreement? What do we do when some traditions we cherish contradict what we agreed to do, when we signed on the dotted line?

What would YOU do, if YOU were the Community Lay Director?

I cannot possibly ignore my agreement, because GOD is in the picture here. It doesn't matter whether I agree or disagree with everything the Upper Room states that we should do in the manuals. What matters, to me, is that I signed my name to the agreement, knowing that it is a covenant agreement, and then I got an education about what is in those manuals.

We, as a community, do have choices. We can make the choice to willingly, with an open heart, follow our agreement. Or, we can, as a community, make the choice to willingly ignore what we know, and ignore our agreement.

Ignore our covenant agreement. Is that really a choice? It's not a choice for me. I can't do it. Can't.

My first priority is to God. My agreement with the Upper Room is also an agreement with God. As much as I hate conflict, and really, REALLY, hate to have people dislike what I say and do, (who doesn't fear rejections?), I must follow what I believe is God's leading. And, I must tell you, that God really is leading our community to follow Upper Room guidelines, (I could tell you stories....).

I pray that we can all be in unity, and at peace with each other. I hope we will be patient when changes take place that we may not understand, at first. After all, if we truly believe that God has inspired the Emmaus weekends, why should we worry over changes that bring us even closer to the guidelines that have been prayed over for decades?

Please pray for your Board of Directors. They serve with a willing heart, at a time when it's not easy to be a board member. If you want to speak with me, about anything concerning our community, please give me a call or send me an email.

In Old Testament times, a covenant was sealed by the sacrifice of an animal, thus making it a "blood covenant" and forever binding. Life had to be given and blood had to be shed. What God demonstrated through the sacrificial system of the old covenant became the new covenant in Christ Jesus. There has been a final "blood sacrifice". Covenant is about relationship with long-term commitment, believing in one another and walking it out together. It carries with it a mutual responsibility on the part of God to us and us to God (Hebrews 8:10, "I will be their God, and they will be my people"). When we live in covenant relationship with God and each other, our lives will be blessed.

Team Selection Committee Report

Becky has asked that I report to the Community regarding the changes that are being implemented by the Team Selection Committee, (TSC), as we move to be in compliance with the Upper Room Handbook on Emmaus. As the Committee has been working with the Weekend Lay Directors for our Fall 2009 and Spring 2010 Walks, the following process has been implemented that seems to be well received and working well:

- 1. The TSC identifies candidates to the Local Board for the Leadership Teams for upcoming Weekends candidates for Weekend Lay Director (WLD), Assistant Lay Director (ALD), Music Director (WMD), and Head CHA.
- 2. The TSC works with the Board selected WLD to identify the WLD's Leadership Team from the Board approved pool of leadership candidates.
- 3. The TSC provides the WLD with a pool of Team candidates from whom the WLD can select and recruit their Team. In some cases the TSC recommends specific persons to Team in order to ensure that person will have the opportunity to progress in servanthood. All potential Team members are selected from candidates with current applications.
- 4. The TSC, working with the WLD, identifies assignments for Team members that is spiritually discerned and focused upon each Team member's progression in servanthood.

Progression in servanthood is the Upper Room guideline that Community members who desire to Team be given the opportunity to progress from anonymous service like cha, prayer warrior, and such through Table Leader, Assistant Lay Director and Lay Director. A similar progression is being looked at for Music Director.

Your Team Selection Committee is striving mightily to be a tool of the Lord in these matters and in full compliance with the guidelines provided by the Upper Room. We urge each and every one of you in the Community who wish to Team to submit an application to Team. Your application is good for two (2) years. Further, we urge each of you who choose to Team to give serious thought to your progression in servanthood.

Do you wish to progress to Table Leader then continue as an Assistant Weekend Lay Director and future Weekend Lay Director? Or would you like to progress from Table Leader along the music chain to Weekend Music Director? Or would you like to continue to serve as needed without progressing?

All of us on the Board and the Team Selection Committee look forward to working with each of you to ensure that you have every opportunity to serve our Lord as He wishes and you discern.

Directions to Camp Happyland:

21457 Happyland Drive Richardsville, VA 22736

From Central Park in Fburg: Drive 7.5 miles west on Route 3. Turn right (North) on Route 610, Elys Ford Road. Drive 9 miles north on Route 610. Just prior to the green Richardsville sign, turn right (East) on Route 619, Richards Ferry Road. Drive 1.3 miles to Happyland Drive. You will see a large Camp Happyland sign on the right side of the road. Turn right into the Camp and proceed to the parking area. Total distance from Central Park is about 18 miles.

Directions to Stafford Crossing Comm Ch: 28 Potomac Creek Dr Ste 101 Fredericksburg, VA 22405

From 95: Take the Centreport Parkway Exit #136 to Route 1. Take Rt 1 North one mile to Potomac Creek Drive on the right. Take the second right on Potomac Creek Drive into the complex. (Note: This is our office location and mailing address only. Sunday service is held at Stafford Senior High School.) Parking is limited so we encourage you to car pool to the Gathering.
